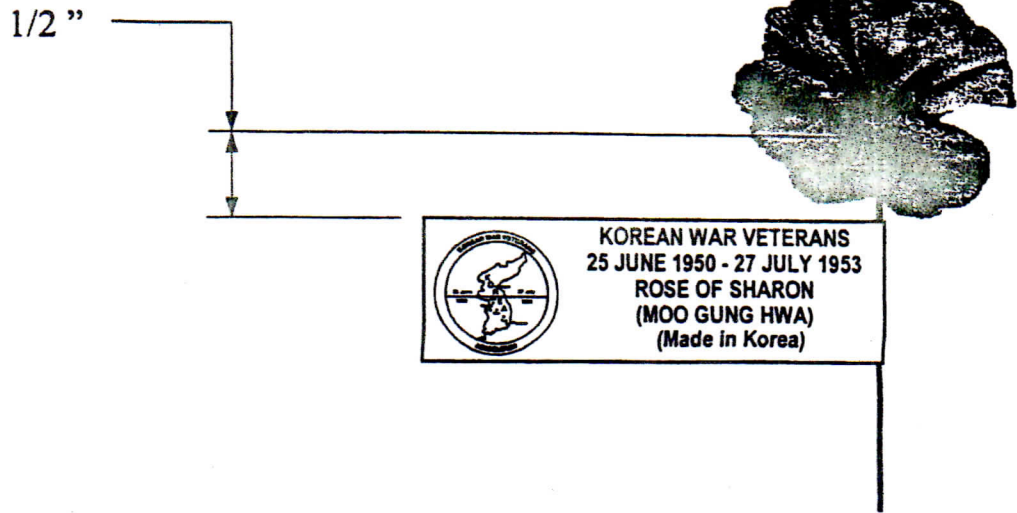


ROSE OF SHARON



The "ROSE OF SHARON" (MOO GUNG HWA) is the National Flower of South Korea. The Maryland Chapter has 'Copyrights' to this flower for the colors and details as follows:

The petals (12) are white with a light blue center at the middle at the stem. Projecting from the center stem outward toward the top and about the pedals are ten small stamens of bluish-pearl like color representing the (10) campaigns of the Korean War. (See below) The blue and white colors represents the U.N. Flag.

A white tag is placed around the stem about 1/2 inch down from the lower pedals (Tag is 1" x 2 5/8") with the bold black lettered inscription as shown below:

Korean War Veterans
25 June 1950 - 27 July 1953
Rose Of Sharon (Moo Gung Hwa)
Korean for 'Rose of Sharon'
(Made in Korea)

The other side of the tag is blank for placing your organization, or whatever you wish to add.

KOREAN WAR MAJOR CAMPAIGNS - 1950 -1953

1. - UN DEFENSIVE 27 June 1950 to 15 Sept. 1950, inclusive.
2. - UN OFFENSIVE 16 Sept. 1950 to 2 Nov. 1950, inclusive.
3. - CCF INTERVENTION 3 Nov. 1950 to 24 Jan. 1951, inclusive.
4. - FIRST UN COUNTEROFFENSIVE 25 Jan. 1951 to 21 April 1951, inclusive.
5. - CCF SPRING OFFENSIVE 22 April 1951 to 8 July 1951, inclusive.
6. - UN SUMMER-FALL OFFENSIVE 9 July 1951 to 27 Nov. 1951, inclusive.
7. - SECOND KOREAN WINTER 28 Nov. 1951 to 30 April 1952, inclusive
8. - KOREA SUMMER-FALL 1952 1 May 1952 to 30 Nov. 1952, inclusive.
9. - THIRD KOREAN WINTER 1 Dec. 1952 to 30 April 1953, inclusive.
10. - KOREA SUMMER 1 May 1953 to 27 July 1953, inclusive.
